The Boise Kimber Christian Leadership School, which follows the model of the COPP program, was established in the State of Connecticut in August 2008.

Program Overview

Our program is a 2-to-4-year program with each of the **Phases being completed in 6-month semester sessions**. Upon completion of each Phase students will receive a **Certificate of Completion**. Upon completion of all 4 Phases of the program students will graduate with **The Diploma of Christian Education**.
